

DRIVING ECONOMIC GROWTH

The opening of Epic Universe marks a pivotal milestone for Universal Orlando Resort (UOR), amplifying its role as an economic catalyst for the Orlando region and beyond. This world-class entertainment resort complex will draw millions of new visitors, boost tax revenues, drive traffic to new & established businesses, enhance local infrastructure, and facilitate community investment.

Universal Destinations & Experiences (UDX) commissioned an economic impact study from Dr. Sean Snaith, an esteemed economist and Director of UCF's Institute for Economic Forecasting, details of which are highlighted here.

Tourism

Infrastructure
